Rolled Paper Animals

Objective:

To create a recognizable low relief image of an animal; using rolled magazine paper glued to mat board.

Guidelines:

- 1. Using the Internet find an animal from a good angle you would like to recreate out of paper. You may select a side view, front angle or just the face. Try and select an animal that has variations in texture or fur. This will make it easier to improvise when selecting colors from magazines. (There is rarely pages in a magazine that have solid color) Print your photograph.
- 2. Using the projector system in the back room trace your animal onto the matboard. Pay close attention to how you position the animal on the paper. Make it big enough to take up the space.
- 3. Using MAGAIZES ONLY, start by ripping out pages with the colors you will need.
- 4. Start by rolling tubes of colors. Make sure the color you are looking for are showing on the outside of the tube. Use glue stick to glue the tube shut. I would suggest making a variety of tube sizes for different functions.
- 5. Start placing the rolled paper inside the areas you traced. Using Elmer's liquid glue start gluing your paper in the appropriate spots. Refer to the colors on your printed photograph.
- 6. Be creative on how you place your paper on the page. You may layer, cut angles and use any side of the rolls you choose.
- 7. Make sure you fill the space; I should not see the matte board behind the tubes.
- 8. Once you get on a roll, (no pun intended) watch the portrait come to life. Take your time and have fun making an amazing final product.
